

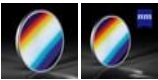

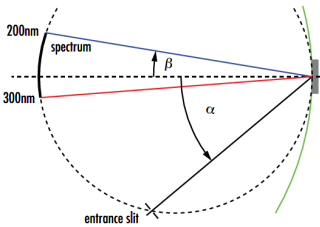

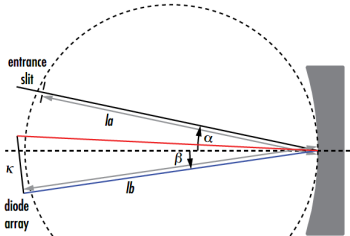

Diffraction gratings with Rowland Circle or polychromator mounting configurations are available. Rowland Circle gratings are ideal for spectroscopic systems designed on a Rowland Circle while polychromator gratings are optimized for setups with a fixed arrangement of the entrance slit, grating, and plane sensor.
